**DAY TWO: HUD Debrief** 

The HUD Site Visit was intended to orient our HUD representatives to the Bartram Village and the surrounding neighborhood, and to introduce them to residents and key partners. It also afforded the opportunity for the HUD representatives to present valuable feedback to the planning team.

- Community meeting allowed representatives to hear directly from both BV residents and other community members
- HUD debrief on day two emphasized the importance of engaging diverse partners, particularly those with the influence to inspire others in the community to engage
- Suggestions on governance structures that have worked in other cities, including use of facilitators or conveners
- Emphasis on moving expeditiously to meet grant milestones for 24-month planning period (Needs Assessment, Outline with Content, Draft Plan, etc.)

- Findings will form the basis of the plan's goals and strategies







**Format:** We're looking mostly for multiple choice or yes/no questions, although a few open-ended questions are ok.

**Length:** We expect it to take about 45 minutes to complete, which is lengthy, but it covers a lot—so try to be mindful of asking questions efficiently.

#### **Collection:**

- Bartram Village Resident Survey will be launched at a Summer Festival on June 22 with a special incentive for participation
- After the Festival, on-site sessions at Bartram Village will be held weekly
- An online version will be available on the website
- Resident ambassadors will be given stipends to encourage their fellow residents to participate
- We will explore making surveys available in conjunction with recertification process
- Neighborhood Surveys will be available through our partners and administered at special events throughout the neighborhood

**Analysis:** We will use Survey Monkey to analyze the findings and present a summary of the findings in the Fall.
