

ACTION ACTIVITIES

In addition to funding to develop a Plan, the Choice Neighborhoods Initiative Grant includes funds for early investments in the neighborhood after the plan is completed.

THE ACTION ACTIVITIES COMMITTEE WILL INCLUDE:

BARTRAM VILLAGE RESIDENTS, NEIGHBORHOOD RESIDENTS, & PLANNING PARTNERS



WHAT TYPES OF ACTIVITIES ARE ALLOWED?

• **Physical** community development, or economic development projects that enhance and acelerate the neighborhood's transformation.



SELECTION PROCESS

- An Action Activity Committee is being set up RIGHT NOW.
- The Task Forces will provide ideas to the Committee to review.

WHAT IS NOT ELIGIBLE?

 Funds may not be used for non-physical uses, basic infrastructure, or housing development activities.



COMMITTEE TASKS

- Develop criteria to evaluate potential Action Activities
- Select Action Activities and submit to HUD by November 27, 2019
- Oversee projects through completion (March 2020 through August 2021)

EXAMPLES:

- Turning vacant property into gardens, pocket parks, or land banking
- Beautification, placemaking, and community arts projects
- Facade improvement programs
- Fresh food initiatives
- Gap financing for projects that are ready for implementation and have only a modest gap in fundraising






