





BV survey takers feel their health could be improved by:

Top health issues affecting BV survey takers and their families:

- 1 ASTHMA/BREATHING ISSUES
- 2 DEPRESSION, ANXIETY & POST-TRAUMATIC STRESS
- 3 HIGH BLOOD PRESSURE

69% of BV survey takers would like to buy a home

Top 3 types of housing that Neighborhood residents feel are needed:

- RENOVATED HOMES FOR HOMEOWNERSHIP
- 2 SENIOR HOUSING
- 3 NEW AFFORDABLE RENTAL HOUSING

#### HEALTHY FOOD

40%

of BV survey takers do not have enough food to eat once or twice a week or more

60% & 68%

of BV residents of Neighborhood residents rated the availablity of high-quality fresh fruits, vegetables and food as Fair to Very Poor


of BV resident children under 5 participate in an early childhood education program (according to survey)


